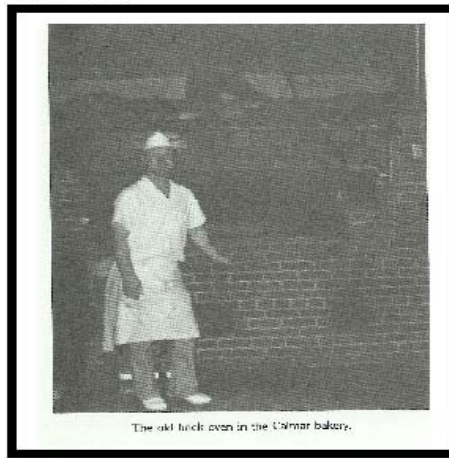
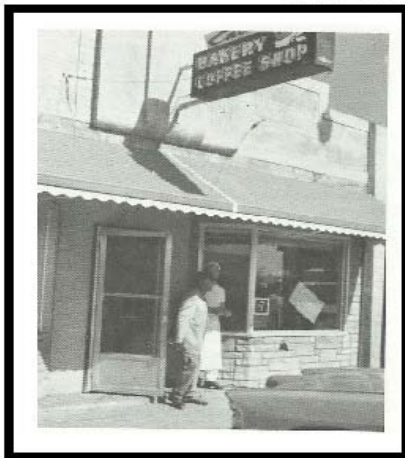


Karen's Cafe

CALMAR BAKERY



The old brick oven in the Calmar bakery.

Built in 1950 by Bill Sol.

The old brick oven weighed 20 tons and sat on a four foot deep pad of cement. The oven was fired up each evening before the owner left and would turn in the morning when he returned. He was able to bake all day from the stored heat in the bricks. The oven was replaced in 1979.

BRICCO RISTORANTE ITALIANO

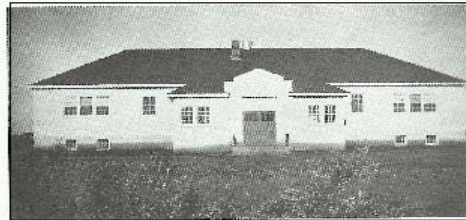


Originally built and operated by Thomas Bros. The barbers shop occupied the attached small building. It is now Bricco Ristorante Italiano.

CONVENIENT VIDEO

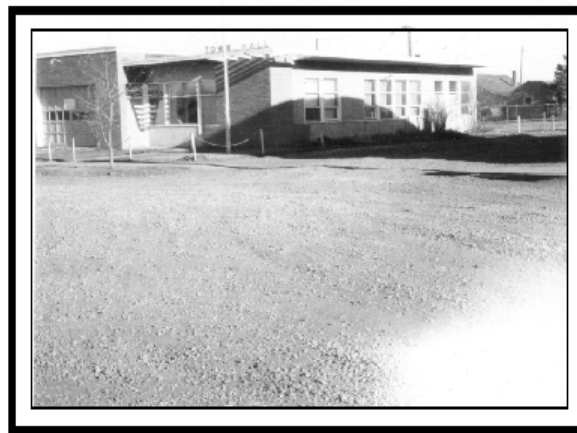


Originally the site of Hoffmans Hardware which burnt down in the fire of 1945.

Cockshutt Farm agency acquired in 1945 by Ray Dixon and opened as Dixon Bros.

Later becoming Calmar Farm Industries and today is the video store and storage company.

CALMAR FIRE HALL



Calmar is proud to boast its own Volunteer Fire Department. The building originally housed both the Fire Department and the Town Office.

FIRST STOP AUTOMOTIVE



Built in 1947 by Tom Tomaszewski.

Owned and operated over the years as various automotive businesses. This building was destroyed by fire in the early 2000's and is now the site of Calmar Co op.

HAYDUK LUMBER & HARDWARE STORE



Hoffmans Store

In 1915, Joe Hoffman bought the empty Co-op building and started a General Store

Bill Hayduks Store

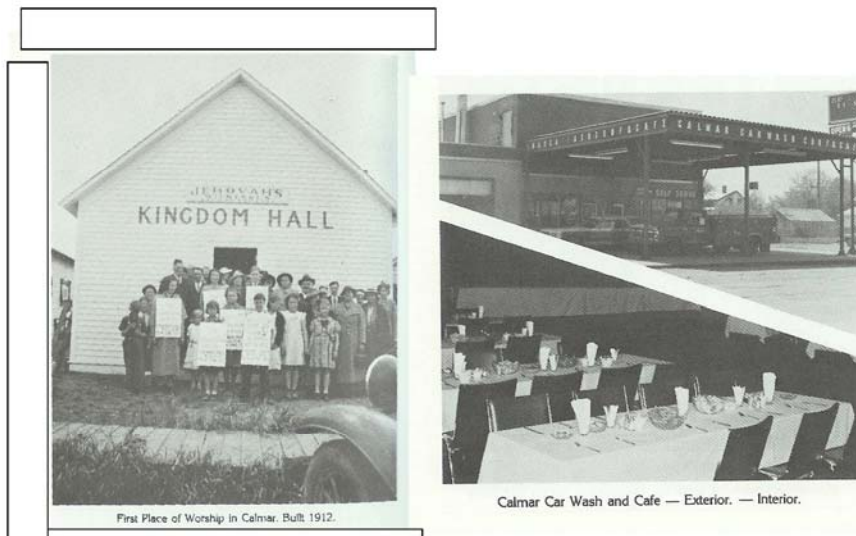
After the Calmar Fire, Bill Hayduk purchased the Hoffman property and built a new store. The grand opening was in 1949.

LEES FAMILY RESTAURANT



Built in 1947 and operated over the years as a Farm Machine agency. The picture shows the building when it was operated as a John Deer Agency by Wedman and Maine.

CALMAR MEDICAL AND DENTAL CLINIC



Site of the first place of worship - Kingdom Hall built in 1912 and lost in the fire of 1945. Later developed as Gas Station and car wash, complete with café. It is now the site of the new Medical and Dental Clinic.

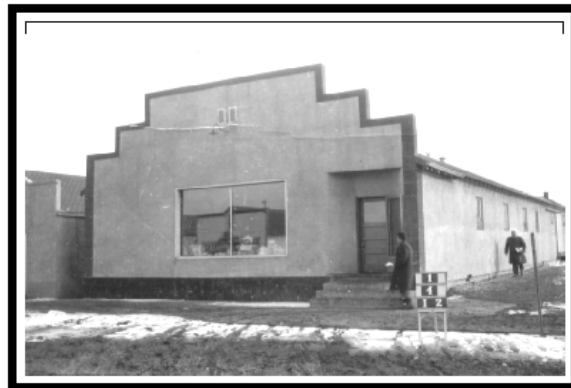
THEATRE PLACE APARTMENTS



Theatre Place Apartments is one of the few brick buildings in Calmar.

Believed to be built in the early 40's by Fred Hayduk

SERENDIPITY SALON



Building as once owned and operated by Steve Workun in 1957 as Store and Warehouse.

CALMAR UNITED CHURCH



The original Calmar United Church built 1934 on lot donated by Mr. and Mrs. Olaf Engberg.

In 1957 the church received a loan from the Home Mission Board and Presbytery to rebuild.. The church still stands as you see it today.

CALMAR VALUE DRUG MART



The site of Calmar Lumber and Hardware operated by Fred and Matt Hayduk (1924-1940). Although the building has undergone many changes, it is still be recognisable today.

WOODLAND PARK - PIONEER PLAQUE



Mrs. Kottgard, Mrs. Olga Serede and Mrs. Doty Scott at Cairn erected by the Conjuring Creek Womens Institute in memory of the first settlers in the Colmar district.



September 18, 1908 (L. Governor J.W. Grant Mrs. Evans and Mrs. C.H. Scott at the unveiling of the Memorial Cairn in Woodland Park Colmar. The Cairn was a Centennial Project in memory of the early pioneers of the Colmar District.
